Wheels that Heal Car Club is a non-profit organization (Tax ID # 04-3785338) dedicated to community service. We had a greatly successful 2021 season, and are currently seeking sponsors for this year's car shows and the Salisbury Cruise-in.

In addition to these shows we also host the Salisbury Cruise-in at Shoppers' World Shopping Center which is generally the third Saturday of each month from April through September. These monthly cruise-ins raise money for individual charities such as the Humane Society, Military Appreciation Night, Alzheimer's Association Salisbury Chapter, First Responders, Salvation Army Youth Programs and Halo Ministry. The shows generally attract 200 to 300 cars and the cruise-ins draw up to 150 vehicles per event.
